4. REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

I have acted as President for Fraser Valley Ringette for two terms now and it has been a great experience with lots of learning. I am very honored to work with such a dedicated group of executive members who volunteer on the Board of Directors with me. I am also grateful to the many members of our association who work so hard volunteering as we work throughout each season. We have often been commended by our ringette league counterparts for our successful association in terms of organization, structure and dedicated volunteers. This is a huge compliment.

Just to highlight a few of the wonderful adventures this season;
We started the year off with several new board members eager to get started.

Thank you to Melissa McCaskill, our registrar, we switched to an on line registration system which came with a few hiccups but overall it has helped us to be far more efficient and has been well received by the membership.

Our player numbers were very strong in 2012/2013 with over 200 registered. As a result of this growth, we were able to field 2 U9 teams, 3 U10, teams, 3 U12 teams, 2 U14 (A and B) teams, 1 U16 team, 1 U19 team, 2 Open (A and B) and as a result of the committed efforts from Laara Green, a Masters team.

Shelly Boone, our Dir of Promotions worked steadily throughout the season to drive recruitment and support on going excitement for our players. This executive position is arguably not only exciting and challenging but one of the most valuable positions we have. We always need new Ringette players.

Thanks to the hard work of Richard Chegwidden, we ran evaluations this past season with a few changes to the program. We were afforded some helpful feedback and hope to once again offer a positive evaluation program.

Ice Scheduling is a huge challenge and if not managed well, can be a nightmare for an association. Tanya Braithwaite, who was new to the board last year jumped in with both feet and as a result of her exceptional organizational skills, things ran very smoothly.
We are anxious to secure ice at the Langley Events Center again as we lost it 2 years ago to Lacrosse during our SOW tournament.

Paul Linke, new to our board eagerly commenced a very successful player development program ensuring a focus on all groups including goalies. Paul worked hard all season to ensure that players were able to have good use of the additional player development ice times that FVR has been able to carve out.

With regard to Goalies, The Keely Brown Goalie School was able to come to BC for the first time. With the support of LMRL through gaming monies, associations were helped to get all interested goalies into the program. FVR was able to also contribute financial support to this program.

We will be once again having Keely Brown come to BC to run her Goalie school.

On this same note, JoAnn Pearson did a great job to ensure that our goalies, especially at the lower level were well equipped with gear. JoAnn has worked hard over the season to ensure that teams have had the gear and equipment needed without delay.

We launched a new web site with the creative and strategic planning of Lars Nordal and Shannon Anderson. Both worked tirelessly on it and as you will see, we have a superior web site. Thank you to Lars for all the regular communication to the association members throughout the year. Communication is key to the success of any organization and Lars worked very diligently to ensure that the FV members were informed.

Paul Payne, Director of Coaching worked tirelessly to recruit, retain and support coaches. Paul wore many hats this season and when not coaching, he was helping with Come Try Ringette Events, helping other coaches on and off ice, reffing generally having fun while doing it all.

With the efforts and hard work from Pete Smit and Nicole Borges, we offered, for the first time, an information session at the beginning of the season. This was designed to help parents, players and coaches better understand shot clock, score sheet, clock operation and general rules. It was well received and Pete secured feedback so that the program can once again be offered with some adjustments.

Leanne Hattie, our Director of Officials helped support this event by teaching shot clock. Leanne is another executive member who has worked tirelessly to ensure refs are at all the games, development opportunities are happening and in general officials feel confident in their jobs. As we all know this is a difficult job and we at Fraser Valley are lucky to have strong officiating and experience.

Our Annual Michelle Vandale Sprit of Winter Tournament was a huge success and offered some exciting new programs. We had over 40 teams participate this year and while there are many to thank for the success of the tournament, Suzie Otty must be recognized and commended. I will let Suzie Otty speak to tournament but on behalf of Sharon Smit, I want to remind everyone about the fantastic and exciting Flash Mob that took place during the opening ceremonies. Sharon was successful in getting up to 300 players/parents to participate in this surprise flash mob, which can be seen on U Tube. Sharon has advised me that the video has seen over 7000 hits and her goal is to have it seen around the world with more than 40,000 hits.

Each year, for the past 3, the Bettles family has kindly offered a scholarship opportunity in Michelle Vandales' name. This Scholarship is a value of \$1000.00 and is awarded during SOW tournament. This year, year the recipient was Courtney Greaves from Port Coquitlam.

FV also hosted the A Provincials, which saw 20 teams play at a high level. The event was met with success and over all teams played hard. The Open A team took home a gold medal the Sportsmanship award. U19 took home silver.

B Provincials were hosted in Surrey and Open B took home Bronze. Congratulations to all of the teams who participated.

I would like to also congratulate the U16 Team BC who took home the gold this year. We had 4 Fraser Valley Players on this team; Sarah McDonald, Tiana Olive, Rachel Gauthier and Sydney Schwartz. Our own Mitch Schwartz helped to coach this team to a win. Congratulations.

From a financial perspective, the year ended on a positive note. We were successful in securing gaming funds in the amount of 32,000.00, which afforded the association some great opportunities to pass along to the players (tournament fees, additional player development, extra equipment etc.). Laara worked hard to keep us all accountable and on track with association funds and program spends. I will let Laara, as treasurer; speak to more specifics in this regard.

At the BCRA level there have been some changes to Governance. Without boring you too much the Coles notes are that it is basically a new model of governing an Association. Where this may pertain and be of interest to you is that this new model of Governance tasks 5 chair people (elected) to chair 5 committees specific to 5 different strategic areas of our sport and all that it may entail. Please go to the BCRA web site for information regarding the committees.

This re-structuring has been slow to transition but the positive side to all of this is it gives associations and its members more input and ability to make change than before. For example, one of the Committees is Sport and Development. This is an area I am very interested in and as such, I volunteered to be one of the representatives on the committee. Part of the work that we will be doing pertains to safety including concussion awareness and prevention. We are also working towards the development of U12 and bringing tiering back. You should know that as a member of the committee I am passionate for this to happen and a big advocate for it. I will be representing the Lower Mainland and FVR in this area and as such, welcome all feedback and input. If change is made, the hope is that it will roll out soon.

This coming year, Mission is hosting the BC Winter Games. I am very excited to announce that Tanya Braithwaite has offered to be the Zone Representative and Paul Payne has offered to be the

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Hello, my name is Laara Green I have been the Treasurer for the past 3 seasons. I have enjoyed being involved with the FVRA executive and have learned a lot from it. Due to other commitments I will be stepping down from my position this year, but I will help out whoever takes over the position of Treasurer.

Now to the numbers

Our net income for the season was a loss of \$8,890.94. The reason we show a deficit this year is because of the \$13,000 of extra gaming funding that was 10 days before the end of last season. These funds were included in the 2012/13 income. This made last year have a high income and this season shows a loss, but over the two seasons we are still up by \$8,881.80.

If you turn to your balance sheet provided you will see that our Total Current Assets (cash in bank) is:

\$37,841.46 between both the General Account and Gaming Accounts

We have an additional \$860.00 in accounts receivable.

This brings our total Assets to \$38,701.46 – putting us in a great position for next season and gives us a bit of cushion for the future.

The budget for the 2013/14 season will be discussed later in this meeting under New Business ... but overall the budget is contingent on the gaming funds to make our budget work. We apply in May and don't get an answer until mid August so we may have to adjust our budget and plans at the starting of Ringette season in September.

QUESTION from Michael Vandas: Can we use the Budget surplus to pay for full ice sheets for practice?

ANSWER: Ice is at its peak right now – we cannot get anymore unless it is at 5am or 11pm which would not be advantageous to our ringette teams. However, we can look into using it for dry-land training.

QUESTION from Sharon Smit: Did the Provincials make a profit.

ANSWER: yes approximately \$2,000

MOTION: Theresa Leslie motions to accept the 2013/2014 Budget. Pete Smit seconded. All in favor (30). **Motion passed.**

REGISTRAR'S REPORT:

I'm Melissa McCaskill, and this is my second and final year in my term as FVRA Registrar. I will not be staying on for the upcoming season. Hopefully, my efforts over the last 2 years will make for a smooth transition for my successor.

Last season we implemented our on-line registration system, and I was happy with the results of that. We had about 35% of our members register on-line. We hope to see that number at least double this year. We also had our highest number of registrants last year (in recent memory anyway!) and that was a total of 205 players.

Registration will open May 15th, for the 2013-2014 season, and we are still carrying forward with the goal of 100% on-line registration by next season. As of this moment, it is not totally possible due to some system limitations, but I do hope that by the start of next season that will be accomplishable. There will also be a push towards eliminating the service charge for on-line registration, which will help us to achieve this goal.

Overall this year, members will not see any major changes to the registration process. Fees are to remain the same, as will the on-line process, and for those who need it, the manual form will remain the same as last season.

In closing, I want to say that I have enjoyed my time on the board, and feel privileged to have been a part of such a great group of people, who truly give of themselves with the common goal of promoting their love of the sport, and trying to ensure that each of our members needs are met. I'll miss all of you, but I'll still be around!!!

DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPMENT'S REPORT:

This year in Player Development we provided both skills development and skating development to U-10, U-12, U-14, and U-16 girls. With 4 consecutive sessions before Christmas and 3 consecutive sessions after Christmas, we used Jen Wakefield and Jody Meadows as instructors. We also provided Goalie coaching with the help of Norm Reader, Sasha and Keely Brown, and Shannon Bettles for the months of November and February, again at no cost to the participants. Here we were able to provide practice support for coaches at all levels from U-12 to U-19, although for scheduling reasons goalie coaches were only able to work with teams sporadically. We also promoted a couple of Goalie Development Camps throughout the season. Feedback from parents and coaches was mostly supportive of our efforts and showed an appreciation for the value of the training, however better communication between myself, coaches and player development coaches would help for next year. Consideration should also be given to better matching of player development instructors with appropriate-aged players and having more consecutive sessions of goalie training to better reinforce skills.

We did a lot to incorporate other activities besides games for all our divisions.

A new event this year was the Gym Ringette Jamboree held on the Roller Hockey Arena for the two FV U9 teams and the eight U10 teams. The Gym Ringette was directed by Shelly Boone, our Promotions Director with assistance from Niki Lacey from the Surrey Association and Lainie Winthrop from BCRA.

The Opening Ceremonies game was interrupted by a Flash Mob in the 1st intermission. This was put on by many teams in the Lower Mainland. It was videotaped put on YouTube for everyone to watch. The mastermind and choreographer of this mob was Sharon Smit of FV. It's hard enough to organize one's own team, let alone Ringette teams from all over the Lower Mainland to make a dance production. Kudos' to Sharon for doing this and keeping it all a secret!

This year's recipient of the \$1000 Annual Michelle Vandale Memorial Scholarship is Courtney Greaves from the PoCo Ringette Association. Courtney is a player, coach, volunteer, and referee in her Association and will be attending SFU in September.

Back at the end of the last season, Fraser Valley put in a bid to host the Provincial 'A' Championships here in Langley. As you can see, we did host the 'A' Provincial Championships on March 1-3rd, 2013. With only 10 weeks between tournaments and 8 weeks of preparation time, we managed to pull it together and to pull it off with a very successful tournament.

The Michelle Vandale SOW tournament netted Fraser Valley \$4500 and the Provincial 'A' Championships netted \$2000 for a total of \$6500 for Fraser Valley.

Thank you to all the volunteers who stepped up to help as committee members... The most common response from team survey was how well organized our tournaments are and how much fun it has been for the teams that attended. This isn't possible without your assistance.
